REFLECTION

Caring for Our Church's Endangered Species

Are young people an endangered species in our church? If so, what are effective strategies to address this crisis?

The 2019-20 Australia bushfires resulted in the loss of about 71% of koala populations in fire affected areas on the north coast of New South Wales. A foundation was set up and proved so effective that donations were also sourced from international benefactors. This combined with Government grants seeks to both care for affected koalas and restore their habitats.

I suggest a long-term fire has devastated our youth engagement in our church. Back in the 1980's, youth movements such as Antioch were flourishing, and many of those who participated in these Christ-centred, parishbased, small communities would later take on senior leadership roles in parishes, dioceses and a range of church organisations, especially through education.

If we examine the current engagement of young people in leadership roles, it seems that the habitat is all but destroyed. Many efforts have shifted to event engagement such as World Youth Day, youth festivals, and so forth.

While these offer peak experiences for young people, there is an absence of structured pathways, including formation and funding, to participate in church leadership.

The recent Australian Plenary Council acknowledged the importance of honouring the gifts and participation of young people, but rhetoric needs to be met with action.

Young people I speak with who are still active in their faith bemoan the challenge they find in participating at the heart of church life. Older catholics are not making room in parish ministries, and the voice of youth is sidelined when it comes to real decisions.

What is needed? We prioritised funding when the koalas were threatened, and long term planning for their future flourishing is underway. We need to recognise this is a crisis, and respond urgently as a whole church.

20:20 Catholic Questions


Fr Gerard shares how a series of Adult Formation Evenings developed and the interest to continue to learn to grow in faith.

This is an idea that arose over an end-of-week drink. Colin MacLeod is the Director of NCRS (The National Centre for Religious Studies) and is currently involved with developing the new Religious Education Curriculum for NZ Catholic schools. We're both part of Mercy Parish in South Dunedin, where I'm the Parish Priest. Over a beer one Friday we were discussing the new Curriculum and started to ponder how we might offer some quality Religious Education for adults in Dunedin. We're very conscious that many adults and parents of the young people in our schools won't have received any RE since they were at school themselves, if ever. And, we're often struck by the interest of adults when they hear what our young people are learning at school.

We came up with the idea of '20:20 Catholic Questions' and decided upon sessions that would be regular, accessible, brief and held in the same place we pray as a community.



Starting at 20 past 6, we would provide 20 minutes of input, have 20 minutes of questions and guarantee that people would be out the door by 7.00pm. We want the sessions to be regular and so have scheduled them to run every Autumn and Spring. The topics can be random and not connected from week to week. So far we have had 14 sessions involving 10 different presenters, 7 or whom are Dunedin locals.

We're not sure if we've got the day and times right yet. There are not large numbers (about 25) in attendance, yet we know of other parishioners who say they would like to come but don't manage to make it. Those who come along appreciate the opportunity to learn and ask questions and we're keen to keep offering these times of learning. One of these Fridays we will start considering our Spring Sessions.

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Timothy P. O'Malley Ph.D. is academic director of the Notre Dame Centre for Liturgy and director of education at the McGrath Institute for Church Life. He teaches and researches at the University of Notre Dame in liturgical-sacramental theology and is the author of ten books including works on liturgical formation and

the doctrine of real presence. Prof O'Malley speaks at conferences and events throughout the USA and Europe and is a consultant to various committees of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops.



Rev Dr Tom Elich earned a Doctorate of Theology in Paris, specialising in medieval liturgy and sacraments. Since then, he has been director of Liturgy Brisbane. For a decade, he was national secretary for liturgy with the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. In the 1990s, he took part in the work of ICEL, and then

taught liturgy at the Brisbane College of Theology and at ACU. He is a long-time member of the international Societas Liturgica, the Australian Academy of Liturgy, and the National Liturgical Architecture and Art Council. He recently finished almost fifteen years as parish priest at Bulimba in Brisbane.



Sarah Hart is one of the leading figures in contemporary Catholic music today. Her songs of faith, spirit of joy, and love for teaching and leading workshops have touched the lives of thousands. Based in Nashville, Tennessee, she has recorded 12 full-length collections with a signature blend

of folk, pop and rock which delight listeners of every age. Sarah is also a Grammy Nominee and BMI Winner and a Mark Award Winner for TV/Film Music Writing. Her music has been recorded by many artists including Amy Grant, Celtic Women, Matt Maher and The Newsboys.



Dr Maeve Heaney was born in Dublin , Ireland, and is a consecrated missionary of an institute of consecrated life called the Verbum Dei Community. A theologian, musician and composer, Maeve completed a Licentiate and Doctorate in Sacred Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian

University in Rome where she taught for two years. She lectures in Systematic Theology at ACU and works in the area of formation at Holy Spirit Provincial Seminary. One of her strongest interests is bringing together, in theological thought and praxis, the realms of music, theology and spirituality at the service of lived faith and outreach to future generations.

National Centre for Evangelisation's new resources

The National Centre for Evangelisation (NCE) recently launched several new resources which will be of great benefit to those working in pastoral ministry. The resources include a new website and book aimed at those becoming Catholic or returning to the faith, an online video platform and a pastoral study guide based on the decrees and commitments of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia.

A summary of the four resources is provided below.

Becoming Catholic website (becoming.catholic.au)


The new website offers theologically sound, yet simple, explanations for the non-churched about God and what it means to be Catholic. It also provides links to extra material for those who want to dive deeper into the faith. The website has been designed to provide a friendly and welcoming space where seekers can find answers to the most frequently asked questions received by the Catholic Enquiry Centre in recent years.



<u>Becoming.catholic.au</u> also includes a growing library of short testimonies by Australian Catholics, speaking on various aspects of the faith.

The website, which can be viewed as a stand-alone site, is also part of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference's website offerings (www.catholic.au). This will allow website visitors to explore beyond the Becoming Catholic site to see what is on offer from other teams in the Conference. For example, research about the Catholic Church in Australia and the many social justice offerings for groups such as migrants and refugees, those living with a disability, the marginalised as well as care for the environment.





This book includes introductory material found on becoming.catholic.au. It complements the NCE's 2017 publication, Discovering Prayer. The pair of books will be offered free to those who are enquiring about the Catholic faith through the Catholic Enquiry Centre.

For parishes, these books and the website will be very useful to those making enquiries about the faith and those participating in the RCIA process. The books would also be useful gifts for parents participating in sacramental programs, families commencing at parish schools and for high school leavers. Parishes can purchase the books for a minimal cost (a bundle of five copies of either book for \$22 including GST) via the ACBC online shop.

It should be noted that both the website and the book strongly encourage readers to connect with their local parish so they can be accompanied on their faith journey.
